Die Prüfungsordnung für den Masterstudiengang Gerontologie vom 09. August 2006 (Amtliches Mitteilungsblatt der Hochschule Vechta 4/2008 S. 4 ff.) enthält in der Anlage 4 (Diploma Supplement) auf S. 19 unter Punkt 4.2 (Programme Requirements) einen unvollständig in die englische Sprache übersetzten Text. Dieser wird berichtigt und durch den folgenden Text ersetzt:

4.2 Programme Requirements

The Master's course is research-oriented and provides an interdisciplinary perspective. The study programme is designed to deepen and enhance students' existing subject knowledge, skills and methodological competence to a level that will enable them to independently acquire and apply theoretical, empirical and practical knowledge in the field of gerontology. A problem-oriented approach allows correlations to be established between individual, organisational and societal aspects of ageing in the sense of a multi-level analysis and to link them to a problem-based, integrative training of methods. The individual dynamic of life styles, life situations and value orientations of ageing is related to both the conditions of the closer social context and the general conditions of society in order to provide an explanatory context. At the meso-level of the institutional framework of ageing (labour market, economy, social security), the focus is on analysing the forms of organisational as well as environment- and region-related construction of ageing and on investigating their interaction with the situations and styles of living of older people.

The Master's course qualifies for professional research and research-oriented practice in the field of gerontology. This study programme may open career opportunities in all areas of scientific research and teaching, of scientific evaluation as well as of political, organisational and business consultancy, but also permits access to positions in staff units of health service and social welfare organisations, local and regional bodies, social insurance institutions and foundations as well as in other semi-state and private organisations. The graduates are qualified for occupations concerned with academic administration, advisory duties, project management and tasks involving public relations.

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
