He is the chair of Mecila: Maria Sibylla Merian Centre Conviviality-Inequality in Latin America and the editor of the series: Global Entangled Inequalities (Routledge). His areas of interest are social theory, postcolonial sociologies, inequality research, conviviality and difference. His publications include four monographs, about 100 articles and book chapters as well as 13 edited volumes - the most recent is Global Entangled Inequalities.
