Dominic Watt studied at the University of Edinburgh where he obtained a master's degree in Linguistics (Honours). He completed his PhD at the University of Newcastle on Variation and Change in the Vowel System of Tyneside English. Since then he has taught at several universities, including the universities of Edinburgh, Leeds, Aberdeen, London, and York and also the University of Flensburg in Germany. Between 2002 and 2007 he was director of the Phonetics Laboratory at the University of Aberdeen. Between 2007 and 2023 he was first Senior Lecturer in Forensic speech science, then Professor in Linguistics at the University of York. In summer 2023, Dominic Watt was DAAD-guest lecturer at the University of Vechta. Dominic Watt's main research interests are (amongst others): phonetics and phonology, sociolinguistics, dialectology, language variation and language change, forensic phonetics, language and identity, and language acquisition.

**University College, Dublin**

Christine Bonnin is an Assistant Professor in the School of Geography at University College Dublin, in Ireland. A development geographer, her ethnographic and community-based participatory research centres on questions linked to people's livelihoods and access to resources, especially in 'peripheral places', like uplands, borderlands, frontiers and informal settlements. She explores how groups often marginalised in society strive to build and maintain sustainable and meaningful livelihoods, access to land, space, and other resources, and their strategies for coping with (or resisting) wider development policy-related and economic pressures, encroachment, and associated environmental degradation and change. Most of her research has been based in so-called Global South contexts, namely Southeast Asia, Vietnam, and more recently Mozambique in Africa. She has also been working with aligned themes in Ireland and Wales. Christine teaches development geographies modules at undergraduate and postgraduate level, as well as a module on global risks and resilience centred on approaches in geography to understanding hazards, risks, vulnerability and resilience, as well as a module on fieldwork in the Global South with partner universities in Vietnam and Mozambique.

Luiz Eduardo Oliveira graduated in Portuguese-English Literature from the Federal University of Sergipe (1990). He also holds a degree in Law from the same institution (1997). He is a full professor at the Department of Foreign Languages (DLES) and the Postgraduate Programs in Education (PPGED) and Literature (PPGL) of the same institution. He is a CNPq research fellow and director of the research group at the Center for Cultural Studies of the UFS, and chief editor of the Cultural Studies Review (*Revista de Estudos de Cultura*). He is currently Director of the Marquês de Pombal Chair (Camões, I. P. / UFS). Main books: *The Marquis of Pombal and the Univication of Brazil: pombalism, history and literature* (Lisbon, 2024); *The language of the other: essays on English language teaching, literature and culture in Brazil* (Campinas, 2022); *The Brazilian historiography of English literature: a history of English teaching in Brazil (1809 - 1951)* (Campinas, 2015); *The Myth of England: Anglophilia and Anglophobia in Portugal (1386 - 1986)*, (Lisoba, 2014); *Grammatization and Schooling: towards a history of language teaching in Brazil (1757 - 1827)* (Aracaju, 2010). He has published two novels: *Mergulho* (PONTes, 2021) and *Desandada: uma história Aracajuana* (Itabuna, 2023).

Rebecca Carlson is a visual and medical anthropologist studying laboratory research in the biomedical sciences and bioinformatics in Japan. Her research is focused broadly on the production of subjectivities, knowledge and power in the transnational circulation of technology and digital media. Previously, she focused on boundary maintenance in the development and circulation of videogames, including the migration of American fans of Japanese popular culture to Tokyo.

Within that, she studies how algorithms are shaping research and everyday life and the advancing of qualitative methods for the critical study of emerging technologies and artificial intelligence. She is associate professor at Toyo University in the faculty of Information Sciences and Arts.

**Prof. Dr. Adriaan Soetevent**

Prof. Dr. Adriaan Soetevent holds the chair of Microeconomics at the University of Groningen. He coordinates the research line in Behavioral and Experimental economics, chairs the GrEELab laboratory for experimental economic research. He has founded and chairs the signature area on Markets & Sustainability. Prior to returning to Groningen in 2013, Soetevent was part of the Amsterdam School of Economics at the University of Amsterdam, first as assistant professor and as of 2010 as full professor in Empirical Microeconomics. From 2010 to 2013, he served as Director of Graduate Studies at the Tinbergen Institute. Dr. Soetevent has published his work in leading peer-reviewed journals, including American Economic Review, American Economic Journal: Economic Policy, Journal of Industrial Economics, Journal of Public Economics and RAND Journal of Economics. He also regularly serves as a referee for these and other journals and is associate editor of the Netherlands Economics Review (De Economist). RePEc ranks Soetevent among the top 7% of all economists.

**Prof. Dr. Giulio D'Urso**  
**G. d'Annunzio University of Chieti-Pescara, Italien**

PhD, Senior Assistant Professor (RtdB) in Developmental and Educational Psychology at the Department of Psychological, Health, and Territorial Sciences, University of "G. D'Annunzio" in Chieti-Pescara. Expert in Forensic Psychology. My main research interests include analyzing risk and protective factors related to bullying and victimization, the long-term consequences of victimization, as well as the social-cognitive analysis of offenders with a sexual background. I collaborate with Professor Jennifer Symonds from University College Dublin (UCD) on longitudinal studies regarding well-being and violence in childhood and adolescence, and with Professor Dagmar Strohmaier from the University of Applied Sciences Upper Austria on topics concerning victimization and prejudice. At University College Dublin, I was also a postdoctoral research fellow, securing the grant from the Government of Ireland Postdoctoral Fellowship Programme

(Irish Research Council) with the project "Bullying in School Contexts in Ireland." I have been a visiting researcher at the University of Turku (Finland), where I worked with Professors Christina Salmivalli and Jaana Juvonen from UCLA (Los Angeles), at the University of Vechta (Germany), and at the University of Stavanger (Norway).

I am Shingo Uchinokura an Associate Professor at Kagoshima University, Japan. I studied chemistry, completed the Master's Program in Education, and earned a Ph.D. in Education from the University of Tsukuba. After teaching chemistry in high school for seven years, I worked at Shizuoka University for five years. Since 2013, I have had seminars on primary and secondary science teaching and practical teacher training as an Associate Professor at this university. My research focus is on the development of students' scientific competencies for modelling and representation, their conceptual understanding through instructional scaffolding, and the promotion and improvement of teachers' professional training. With an empirical approach, I pursue the psychology of science learners and teachers. In addition, I have a lesson study with the primary and secondary school teachers and provide professional consulting to them. In cooperation with the Kagoshima Science Museum and other colleagues, I am also involved in organising an annual summer science festival for children. As a research fellow at the Japan Textbook Research Center, I contribute to research on textbooks and cooperate with a textbook publisher. Other interests include comparing Japan to other countries and networking internationally with educational researchers.
