



address the environmental sustainability and resilience of competitive land-based primary production for food and non-food systems






THE NEXT EU RESEARCH & INNOVATION INVESTMENT PROGRAMME (2021 – 2027)

Based on the Commission Proposal for Horizon Europe, the common understanding between co-legislators and the Partial General Approach, both approved in April 2019




Horizon Europe: structure





What is in it?

- Sustainable forest management
- EU plant protein production

- Digital innovations

A Strategic Plan gives direction to the work programme

Strategic Plan (new implementing act by the Commission) will prepare the content in the work programmes and calls for proposals for the first **four years**:

Leaving space for new approaches



A mission is a portfolio of actions across disciplines intended to achieve a **bold and inspirational and measurable goal** within a set timeframe, with **impact** for **society** and policy making as well as relevance for a significant part of the European population and wide range of European citizens.

- Horizon Europe defines mission characteristics and elements of governance, and 5
 missions areas. Specific missions will be programmed within the Global Challenges
 and European Industrial Competitiveness pillar (drawing on inputs from other pillars).
- Mission Board: for each mission area 15 experts appointed by the Commission following an open call for expression of interest shall advise upon, inter alia:
 - √ identification and design of one or more missions in the respective mission area
 - ✓ content of work programmes and their revision as needed for achieving the mission objectives, with input from stakeholders and, where relevant, the public







Encouraging synergies

New generation of objective-driven and more ambitious **partnerships** in support of agreed EU policy objectives

Key features

- Simple architecture and toolbox
- Coherent life-cycle approach
- Strategic orientation

Co-programmed

Based on Memoranda of Understanding / contractual arrangements; implemented independently by the partners and by Horizon Europe

Co-funded

Based on a joint programme agreed and implemented by partners; commitment of partners for financial and in-kind contributions

Institutionalised

Based on long-term dimension and need for high integration; partnerships based on Articles 185 / 187 of TFEU and the EIT-Regulation supported by Horizon Europe

Summer 2019

Early involvement and exchanges with Member States, Online consultation with stakeholders and the public at large, Establishment of Mission Boards

Autumn / winter 2019/2020

Co-creation at Research & Innovation Days 24 – 26 September, Exchanges with the new European Parliament, Envisaged endorsement by new Commission of Strategic Plan

Spring /summer 2020

Drafting of Horizon Europe Work Programme 2021-2022 on the basis of the Strategic Plan

November 2020

Pre-publication of Work Programme 2021-2022 Opening of first 2021 calls

December 2020

Formal adoption of Work Programme 2021-2022
